## **The Student Cultural Exchange Programme 2025**

### ***Cultural Horizons Expanded: Auxilium MBA Students Explore the Northeast***

The Student Cultural Exchange Programme 2025 was organized by the PG & Research Department of Business Administration, Auxilium College (Autonomous), Vellore from 10th to 17th November 2025. This programme was organised to provide the MBA students with academic exposure, industry insights, and cultural enrichment through a week-long visit to key institutions and heritage locations in Guwahati and Shillong. The programme commenced on 10<sup>th</sup> November with the arrival of students at Don Bosco Institute of Management, Guwahati. On 11th and 12th November, students participated in intensive workshops on Stress Management and Career Planning at Don Bosco Institute of Management, and enjoyed the serene experience in the Brahmaputra Alfresco Sunset Cruise. On 13th November, the team visited Assam Don Bosco University (ADB) and The NEST, the physical and mental well being Centre, an initiative of the Don Bosco University and then proceeded to Shillong. On 14<sup>th</sup> November visit to Cherapunji included Seven Sisters Waterfall, Mawsmai Cave, and the Riwai Living Root Bridge, showcasing the region's ecological richness. On 15<sup>th</sup> November, students visited IIM Shillong, Don Bosco Museum, and St. Anthony's College for academic and cultural exposure. Returning back to Guwahati on 16th November, the group explored Umananda Temple via river ferry, Kamakhya Temple, and ended the day by shopping at bustling Fancy Market. The programme concluded on 17<sup>th</sup> November with a feedback session at Don Bosco Institute of Management, Guwahati before the delegation departed for the airport.
