

Academic Excellence

Academic Excellence is the foundation of growth, innovation, and success in Higher Education Institutions. Auxilium with relentless spirit has endeavored all through the year over Curriculum design, teaching, and research in this regard.

As per the directives of the State Government, Auxilium College has adopted the TANSCHÉ prescribed syllabus for the academic year 2024-2025. For the effective implementation of the same utilizing its autonomy, the Institution had facilitated the Board of Studies for the various departments in June and November.

All activities of the institution officially began with the Inauguration of the College Union held on 12th August 2024 with the student union leaders and other student leaders taking up office.

10 MoUs were signed this year as a significant step towards academic excellence, collaboration, growth, and innovation to pave the way for knowledge exchange, research opportunities, and mutual development. With the already existing 70 functional MoUs a number of activities like Orientations, Workshops, Industrial visits, Field work and Internships were carried out to strengthen the institution's vision, fostering excellence and creating new avenues for learning and progress.

Effective functioning of various departments is key to the success and smooth operation of an institution. Through teamwork, clear communication, and a shared commitment to academic excellence, each department played a vital role in achieving the educational goal. As per the suggestions and encouragement of the IQAC, optimal use of ERP in governance and teaching - learning, Curriculum revision, introduction of new courses, enhanced infrastructure, innovative teaching practices and reliable and accurate documentation procedures have been carried out along with new initiatives. The following programmes were organized to facilitate the above: FDP on “Idea Generation Method” in August, Orientation on “Education and Social Transformation” in September, Capacity Building Programme on “AI Tools and Techniques for Interactive Online Teaching” on 28th November 2024 and Capacity Building programme on “Enhancing Institutional Performance in Quality Standards” on 27th January 2025.

Green Initiatives

I take immense pride in reporting on green initiatives and practices taken up by the College during the year to promote sustainability and environmental responsibility. By embracing eco-friendly initiatives, Auxilium has been contributing to a healthier planet and setting an example.

On the 10th of September, the campus of Auxilium College, Vellore echoed “Go Green, Glow Green, Grow Green!” as it organised the highly anticipated and historic Mega Seed Ball Fiesta “ECO6G” 2024. The event aimed at creating environmental awareness and promoting sustainable practices, particularly through the large-scale creation of 5 lakh seed balls. The event was inaugurated by Honourable District Collector, Tmt. V. R. Subbulaxmi, IAS. Valedictory Day Report

2024-2025

Academic excellence has served as the cornerstone for growth, innovation, and success in Auxilium for seventy years. This has been attained through unwavering dedication, intellectual curiosity, and a genuine passion for learning. A total of 39 Guest Lectures, including 18 Endowment lectures, 11 International conferences, 5 FDP, 46 Seminars and Webinars, 31 National and International Workshops, and 15 other Academic programmes, were organized by the various departments of the College. Besides the curricular pursuits, various co-curricular and extracurricular activities were organized for the holistic development of the students. With pride we present the efforts and achievements of the departments, associations, groups, movements and clubs.

The Department of History organized celebrations for Independence Day and Republic Day, with student participation through speeches emphasizing their significance. Various competitions, including poster presentations, essay writing, quizzes, dance, and historical pageants, were held to enhance students' engagement with history and cultural heritage. The department also commemorated National days to deepen historical awareness.

The Department of English, in collaboration with the Theatre Club and Journalism Club, organized a Literary Meet in July. The Inter-Year Dramatics Competition on “The Cultural Ethos in Asian Literature” for Shift I was held in association with ELT@I Vellore Chapter. The Inter-Department Dramatics competition, based on “The Chronicles of Narnia”, was held for Shift II. The language-oriented segment of the Student Induction Programme featured engaging literary activities like word puzzles, storytelling, vocabulary games, and the introduction of students to digital tools. A Guest Lecture on “English: The Language of Opportunities,” was organized. 53 students participated in the Shakespeare Institute Talent Examinations, earning the College the Best College trophy, with a student also securing the 1st rank at the State level. The Peace Essay Writing Competition based on the Pope's message was conducted in January.

The Department of Tamil actively organized a series of academic, cultural, and skill-oriented programmes throughout the academic year. The *Muthamizh Vizha*, held in the month of September, was graced by the renowned actor and folk artist Chitira Senan Kathiri as the Chief Guest. In November, a Skill Development Workshop focusing on oration, singing, and drama was conducted to enhance students' creative and communicative abilities. An International Seminar titled "From Reality to Virtuality: Internet and Youth Lifestyle" was organized in December in collaboration with *Ulaga Tamizh Araichi Niruvanam*, Chennai, and Muthukamalam, Theni. In addition, various Endowment Lectures and Competitions such as speech, poetry writing, and essay writing were conducted in memory of eminent personalities including Punith, Vivekananda, Vallalar, Gopalakrishna, Ida Scudder, Xavier Alphonse, Bharathiyar, and Thiruvalluvar. To support students' career aspirations, TNPSA coaching classes were conducted for both UG and PG students every Sunday through online mode. Undergraduate students were also taken on an Industrial visit to the Dinamalar Office, Vellore, providing them with valuable insights into the functioning of a news organization. Students were consistently encouraged to participate in various Inter-collegiate competitions and achieved remarkable success by winning cash prizes worth nearly one lakh rupees.

The Department of Hindi organized various events throughout the academic year to promote Hindi language and literature. In July, the Premchand Jayanthi Samaroh was held, featuring speeches on Premchand and his works, and the "One Hindi Sentence per Day" initiative began in the month of July. An essay writing competition on the contribution of Hindi writers to the freedom struggle was held in August. On 18th September, an Inter-Departmental Hindi Patriotic Song Competition was conducted in commemoration of Hindi Diwas. Poetry writing, Poster-making and Short story writing competitions, Hindi Literary Quiz and a Chart exhibition on Hindi writers were also organized. A National Webinar on "Global Scenario of Hindi" was organised on 10th March 2025.

The Department of Mathematics organized various events to promote mathematical knowledge and skills among students. Notable events included the National Mathematics Day Celebrations on 4th January 2025, in collaboration with the National Council for Science and Technology Communication and Tamil Nadu State Council for Science and Technology, with participation from over 950 students across 22 institutions. The department conducted an Inter-School Math Fest, engaging 300 Higher secondary girls from 9 schools, and inaugurated the Aptitude Achievers Club on 29th January 2025 to train students for competitive exams. The department hosted a Puzzle Contest and Poster Presentation. The department secured the overall championship at the State Level Science Fest 2025 at Don Bosco College, Yelagiri. Students achieved accolades in speech, essay writing, poster presentation, PowerPoint presentation, and short film competitions at various District and State-level events. The department organized competitions such as Sudoku Champs, Essay Writing, Poster

Presentations, PowerPoint Presentations, and Mathematical Art. Quizzes on R Programming and the Indian Constitution served to improve students' technical competencies and civic knowledge. Workshops covering LaTeX, MATLAB, and Advanced AI Techniques for Research Writing offered practical training. An Aptitude Test on Time and Distance and discussions on the Role of Mathematics in Digital Life and Modern Technology underscored its importance in fields such as AI, Space Science, and Research.

The Department of Chemistry hosted the Intercollegiate Chem Fest 2025 in association with RUSAC, providing a platform for students to showcase their scientific knowledge and creativity. The Association conducted the Madame Marie Curie Endowment Lecture-7, featuring insightful discussions on advancements in Chemistry. UG students actively participated in quiz competitions, and PG students presented research papers, fostering intellectual engagement and scientific curiosity.

The Department of Zoology, in association with the College of Nursing, CMC Vellore, organized a Breast Cancer awareness program for UG and PG students. Medical Laboratory Technique students visited the Labs at Sri Narayani Hospital, Vellore. National Wildlife Week was celebrated from 2nd to 8th of October. In collaboration with the Tamil Nadu Forest Department, 1000 saplings were planted in the campus. As part of the extension activity, UG and PG students visited Government Panchayat School, Kangeyanallur, and Vellore to raise awareness on health and hygiene. As part of the Innovative project, an "Awareness Program on Higher Education and Career options in Life Science" was held for higher secondary students at Auxilium Higher Secondary School, Vellore. PG Zoology Students won a cash Prize at Nehru Yuva Kendra District level Yuva Utsav organized at Muthurangam Govt. Arts and Science College, Vellore. In association with Auxilium Innovation and Incubation Centre (AIIC) an Environmental Expo was organized. A Field visit to Fundera Bird's Park, Yelagiri and a Life Science quiz competition was organized. AIIC Zoology Unit Students prepared Beauty Soap using Fruits with zero chemicals. Six Endowment Lectures were also organized for the UG and PG Students.

The Department of Commerce organized various academic and skill development programs throughout the year. A Career Guidance Seminar on CMA & CA was conducted in July, followed by a Student Development Program on Technical Analysis & Portfolio Management. Other key events include an Extempore on Drug Use & Addictions, an Account Opening Mela in collaboration with Indian Overseas Bank, and Seminars on Cybersecurity Insurance and Digital Marketing. Several students participated in external events, including a Business Startup Workshop at Sacred Heart College and an International Conference hosted by the Business Administration Department, where 22 students presented papers. Field visits for III UG students to Madras Atomic Power Station and II PG students to Sri Aurobindo Handmade Paper Industry were organized in January. The department also organized various association activities that include a business quiz, a management quiz, a business proposal competition, "Express It" - a banner-making competition, and an e-poster presentation. A resource talk on "Unlocking the Potential - Becoming a Chartered Accountant" and an online training program on e-commerce and its business opportunities were organized in collaboration with AIIC. Community outreach through extension activities, particularly promoting financial literacy among underprivileged individuals was carried out. As part of this effort, an awareness campaign was conducted to educate people about various flagship schemes of the Government of India.

The Department of Physics organized a visit for 51 students along with the faculty to the U.R. Rao Satellite Centre (URSC) and the Aerospace Museum in Bangalore, gaining first hand exposure to space technology, including Chandrayaan-3 and upcoming satellite missions. The department also undertook an extension activity at Anbu Illam, Sainathapuram. Students actively participated in various external academic events, including the “Ariviyal Sinthanai Nigalvu” at Sacred Heart College, Trippattur, in January, featuring a motivational session by former ISRO Director Dr. Mayilswamy Annadurai. 5 UG students secured third place in the model-making competition at Thiruvalluvar University’s “Science Fest-2025”. The department hosted “Physics Fest-2025,” an intercollegiate event promoting scientific discussions and competitions such as quizzes, model-making, debates, and poster presentations. Students also visited the Madras Atomic Power Station (MAPS) Kalpakkam, a unit of the Nuclear Power Corporation of India Limited (NPCIL).

The Department of Biochemistry conducted an online Quiz program. As part of the extension program, students visited two schools. For industrial exposure, students were taken on a visit to Bionest, an incubation center, providing firsthand experience in Biotechnology and Research advancements.

The Department of Computer Science and Computer Applications organized an industrial visit to Willys Enterprises in Perumugai, Auto Nagar, Vellore as part of an e-waste initiative. Students also participated in “TechFrenzy 2025”, organized by Thiruvalluvar University. The department also conducted various activities to enhance students’ logical, analytical, and professional skills. Events included Riddles Challenge to improve problem-solving, a Poster Presentation on IoT, and a Debate on Social Media Responsibility. A Resume Writing Workshop and Video making competition was organized.

The Department of Microbiology successfully organized an Essay Writing Competition – “Wonders in Microbiology: A Boon to Mankind”. The Fibre Feast – A Culinary Competition, a Just a Minute (JAM) Competition, and a Tableau Competition were held. They showcased the creativity of 19 UG students as they visually represented microbiology-related themes.

The Department of Visual Communication organized Visual Felicity 4.0 and an Art Workshop on Human Portraits, and observed World Photography Day and World Emoji Day. The department also developed e content for schools.

The Department of Psychology visited APPA Mental Health Facility in Tiruvannamalai district in January. 31 third year students went for an Industrial visit to gain insights on Hospital management and Psychological health treatment.

The Department of Commerce (Banking & Insurance) organized monthly Seminars and Webinars on recent developments in Banking and Insurance. A Webinar on “Basics of financial planning and Awareness” regarding market and financial literacy was also organized.

The Department of Business Administration inaugurated an AARI certificate course in collaboration with Madha Educational Trust, Vellore. The training of the second batch of students for the Leather Training Program in collaboration with CFTI (Central Footwear Training Institute), Chennai, commenced. Forty-five third-year BBA students actively participated in the Student Exchange Program occurred at Christ College, Irinjalakuda, Kerala, it was carried out as an academic collaboration under the Xavier Board of Higher Education in India and they also visited Pilot Smith (India) Private Limited, Thrissur, Kerala, gaining practical insights into the food, pharmaceutical, and packaging equipment industries. On behalf of the BBA Association (Suprayoga Prapthi), various competitions such as Promotional Shots, Brand Builders Arena (logo and tagline innovation), and Digital Flyers Extravaganza (E-flyer creation) were organized.

The Department of Business Administration (Hospital Administration) actively engaged students in various academic and extracurricular initiatives throughout the academic year. Students participated in a Student Exchange Programme at Mount Carmel College, Bengaluru. A Workshop on Data Analytics was organized. An HR event in collaboration with Human Capital executed the Talent Nexa Project - Bridging Academia and Industrial Cooperation with HR managers of various industries. Students participated in "STUNA 2025" - STUdents NATIONAL Conference on HR TERRAIN Challenges, Opportunities, and Preparedness organised by NIPM Madras Chapter in association with Loyola Institute of Business Administration (LIBA). The students also won the overall trophies in the intercollegiate competitions conducted at Anna Mira College of Engineering & Technology and Sacred Hearts College, Thirupattur.

The Department of Social Work organized an Observation Visit through various agencies like RUHSA, CMC, Hope House, Shanthi Gramam, MBKG Pannai, Schieffelin Institute of Health and Research Leprosy Centre, Anbu Illam, Adaikalam, Worth Trust, KV Special School, Guild of Service-School for Blind, Thirumalai Charity Trust and Thirumalai Mission Hospital. A Rural Camp was organized for I-MSW students at Pravaham, Palamathi Hills. Programs were conducted on topics like the Importance of Education, the Impact of Alcoholism, the Importance of Agriculture and Importance of Women Empowerment., Gender Discrimination and Women's Education. A Two-Day Skill Training on Empowering Lives: Human Rights and Skill Development Initiative was organized.

Auxilium Student Quality Cell (ASQC) actively engaged students in various initiatives promoting education, fitness, sustainability, and national development. National Sports Day, and International Literacy Day, National Education Day and World Food Day were observed. An Indian Traditional Cuisine Competition was organized. The ASQC also organized the No Drive Day to raise awareness on Air pollution and promote Eco-friendly transportation. An Essay Writing Competition on "The Role of Young People in Nation Building" and a Writing Challenge on "Best Practices of Auxilium College" were held to mark World Thinking Day.

The National Cadet Corps participated in training at Velammal Panchetti School and the Combined Annual Training Camp (CATC). The 10th International Day of Yoga and International Day against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking was observed. "One Cadet, One Tree" initiative was taken up by observing Kargil Diwas. drives, and the Rakshin Project on child protection, were carried out. Notably, Cdt Tamilselvi and SUO Arulkumari excelled in leadership roles, with Tamilselvi representing Chennai A Group at key events, including the Republic Day parade at Marina Beach, Chennai.

NSS volunteers actively participated in various events promoting social awareness, health, and historical significance. The unit commemorated the 218th anniversary of the Vellore Sepoy Mutiny and the World Elephant Day. The Nutrition Month celebration at Melvadugankuttai Village, KV Kuppam Block, was held in collaboration with ICDS, featuring an awareness rally, competitions, and an orientation for mothers. The NSS unit also organized the Pink October Breast Cancer Awareness Campaign from 24th to 26th October 2024 in collaboration with CMC, Vellore, and the Vellore Hair Donation Drive, which included a pink ribbon formation, awareness sessions, a hair donation initiative, and outreach programs for rural women. 50 NSS volunteers also participated in welcoming the Governor of Tamil Nadu, Mr. R. N. Ravi, during the convocation ceremony at Thiruvalluvar University. Students also participated in the District Youth Festival at Muthurangam Government Arts College, organized by Nehru Yuva Kendra, Vellore, securing the highest number of prizes. The National Voters' Day Awareness Rally was conducted in collaboration with the Electoral Literacy Club and District Administration, with over 200 NSS volunteers marching through key locations to promote ethical voting. Ms. Yuvashini, a III BA English student, won third place in the District-Level English Essay Competition on Electoral Awareness, receiving her award from the District Collector of Vellore. The NSS Unit also played a key role in the State Level Assessment Survey (SLAS) in partnership with the District Education Department, enrolling 140 volunteers as Field Investigators for schools in Katpadi Block.

AICUF members participated in a vibrant triple celebration in Chennai, themed “Towards Power for the People.” in August. The commitment to service continued with a Christmas celebration in December, organized by AICUF members in Abdulapuram village.

VIDES actively engaged in various social service initiatives, fostering personal, social, and ethical values among its members. In January, the club visited Mother Teresa Convent in Vellore, where members interacted with residents, provided snacks, and entertained them with dance and conversations, gaining insight into the struggles of differently-abled individuals. The club also organized a village visit to T.K. Puram, Vellore, in collaboration with Don Bosco Brother Lucas, offering free teaching sessions for underprivileged students. 11 members participated in a meeting held at St. Joseph Hr. Sec. School.






